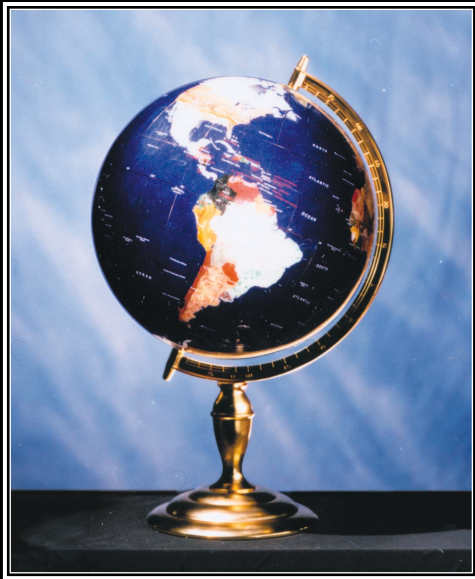

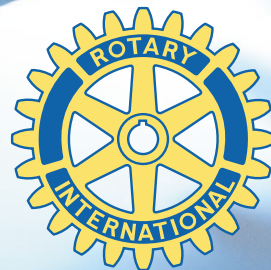
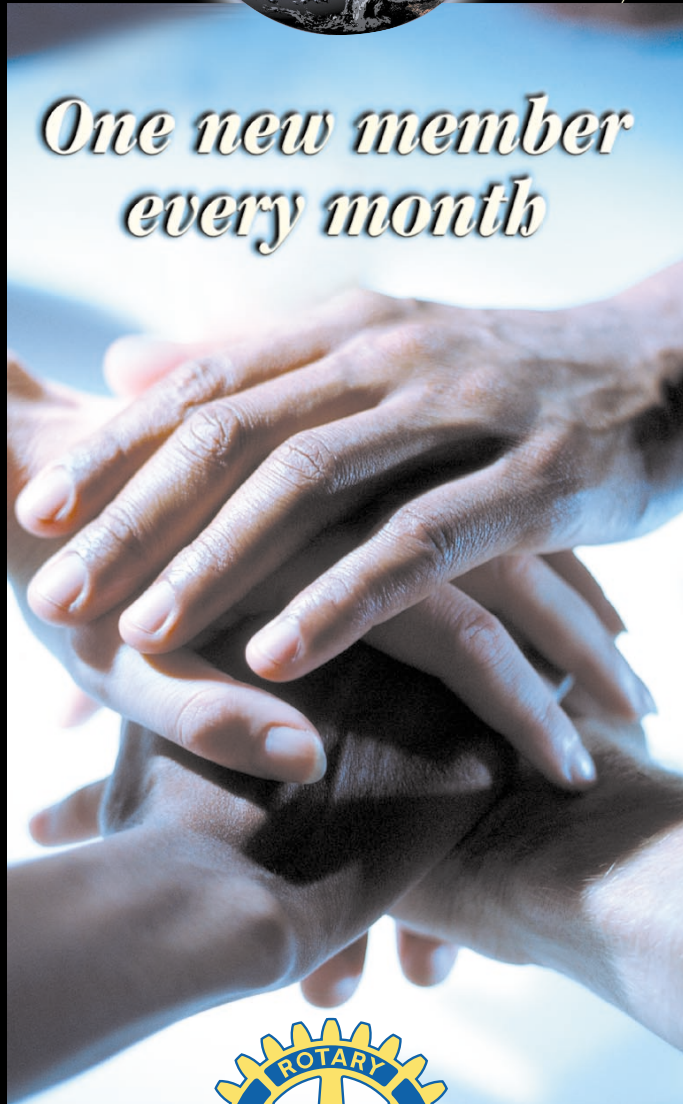

Rotary's Global Quest

Rotary's Global Quest is a major campaign for all Rotarians to increase Rotary membership worldwide. In order to expand its vital humanitarian and educational work and strengthen its efforts to advance peace and international understanding, Rotary must reverse recent membership losses and achieve significant growth.

THE GOAL: Each Rotary club will bring in one qualified new member per month in 2001-02, with a minimum net gain of five new members per club at the end of the year. Each district will form a minimum of three new clubs.

THE CAMPAIGN: Fifty districts and 100 clubs will be designated as Global Quest winners.

At least one winning district will be recognized from each zone, provided the district has achieved the minimum average net growth of five members per club. The district with the largest net gain will be named the overall world winner.

To keep the competition more evenly matched, the clubs will be divided into two categories: clubs with fewer than 50 members and clubs with 50 or more members, as of 1 July 2001. The top two clubs in each zone — one from each category — will be designated as club winners, accounting for 68 of the 100 winners. The remaining 32 club winners will be selected based on net growth — regardless of club size.

Starting figures will be based on the July 2001 semiannual reports received by RI by September 2001. Final figures will be based on figures from the semiannual reports and new member report forms received by RI by 24 May 2002.

THE AWARDS: The 50 most outstanding districts and the 100 most outstanding clubs will receive Global Quest Awards, which are beautiful globes of the world made of semiprecious stones. The size of the globe awarded will vary for world, district, and club winners. In addition, each individual Rotarian who brings in three new members during the year will receive a special recognition pin.

The district governors from the top five world winning districts and the club presidents from the top ten world winning clubs will be invited, along with their spouses, to attend the 2002 RI Convention in Barcelona, Spain, at Rotary's expense, including airfare, room, meals, and registration. The world winners will receive special recognition on stage at the Convention.

DISTRICT-LEVEL COMPETITIONS: Each district is encouraged to conduct a membership competition at the district level and identify a District Global Quest winner. The name of each club that wins the District Global Quest will be published by RI and highlighted at the Barcelona Convention.
